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### **MINUTES**

# MUNICIPAL PUBLIC ACCOUNTS COMMITTEE OF THE BREEDE VALLEY MUNICIPALITY

2019-04-04 AT 10:00

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#### 1. WELCOME AND ATTENDANCE

In terms of the Rules of Order for Internal Arrangement By-Law 2012 the chairperson must take the chair at the time stated in the notice of the meeting or as soon thereafter as is reasonably possible: provided that the meeting does not commence later than 30 (thirty) minutes after the time stated in the notice of the meeting and must proceed immediately with the business of the meeting.

The Chairperson opened the meeting at 10:10 am, welcomed everyone present and asked CIIr J. Robinson to open the meeting with prayer.

#### 2. APOLOGIES

Cllr. Buswana informed the chairperson that she would be late. The following Councillors attended the meeting: N. Nel; J. Jack; M. Jacobs; T. Wehr; E. Vd Westhuizen; L. Willemse; J. Robinson and N. Buswana. No apologies were received from Cllr. C. Wilskut and V. Mngcele.

#### 3. CONFIRMATION OF AGENDA

The Chairperson confirmed the Agenda with no amendments.

#### 4. MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

#### 4.1. CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES

Municipal Public Accounts Committee Meeting held on 20 February 2019.

The Committee approved the Minutes unanimously.

#### 5. STATEMENTS AND COMMUNICATIONS BY CHAIRPERSON

The Chairperson raised her concern regarding the functionality of the MPAC and informed the committee to remember that MPAC is a committee of council and they do what council requested MPAC to do.

The Chairperson further informed the committee that when councillors will be absent, that they must notify her or the speaker and that councillors fill in a leave form.

#### 6. AGENDA

# 6.1 <u>Investigation into progress and/or implementation of council resolution C31/2017.</u> <u>Avianpark Crime Prevention Program.</u>

- Mr. E Cloete gave clarity to the committee with regards to council resolution. He informs the committee that it could not be established what the R300 000.00 had reference to specifically. With regards to the R500 000.00, nearly R200 000.00 was used and there is supporting documentation regarding this. Mr. Cloete informed the committee that he consulted with the Speaker and the Mayor who approached the Provincial Government who also made R500 000.00 available, but it was not paid to the Municipality therefore no reporting can be done at this stage regarding their expenditure. Mr. Cloete further informs the committee regarding the Million Rand that formed part of the discussion, that R500 000.00 is available in the current financial year which complements the initial discussion of a Million Rand.
- The MM clarifies that the question derives not only from the budget, but the question also relates to the interventions that had been made surrounding crime prevention in the Avian Park area and there were also other interventions in the area. An example was the cleaning in the area on a rotational basis by using contractors from the specific area, and this was part of an intervention. A total of 19 contractors were used from the specific area which amounted to approximately 1.368 million rand for that purposes. Also, currently 45 EPWP workers from the area are being used. To assist the youth, 8 candidates were assisted out of the Avianpark area with regards to the bursary scheme which cost the Municipality R27 500. The MM informs the committee that this is not a full bursary, but the Municipality only provides assistance to the individuals. There were also learnership opportunities which included welding, painters and construction and road maintenance concluded with Boland College. For this area specifically, 14 learners were on board and the expenditure amounted to R312 000.00. There were also Ward based projects, of which the documentation is available, which includes aspects like gardens and soup kitchens etc, and the costs of these projects amounted to R47 255.00. The MM informed the committee that the essence of this is that the focus was only on one amount but, the one amount does not represent the full scope of interventions that were actually made and that is why the other aspects were cited as part of the total perspective.
- Cllr. J Robinson asks regarding the R100 000 ward-based projects and what will be done today regarding this.
- Cllr. Nel states that the agenda points for today relates to the R500 000.00 that were made available for the Avian Park Crime Prevention and that the request was what was done with the R500 000.00 for security. The second point relates to the telephone records of the Mayco office.

- Cllr. J Robinson asks whether the information is available regarding the projects mention above.
- Cllr. N Nel informs Cllr. J Robinson that Mr. E Cloete stated earlier that information is available on request.
- Cllr. T Wehr informs the committee that the R500 000.00 of province was applied
  for by the council and approved. This is where IR change comes in and the process
  was through a tender process. They did not give a report to the Municipality but
  gave a report to the Department of Community safety. The other R500 000.00 is
  still available as mentioned by Mr. Cloete.
- Cllr. J Robinson states that there are also other areas that needs to be attended to and the focus should not only be on Avian Park. Cllr. Robinson further states that there should be looked at the success rate when projects are implemented.
- The MM informs the committee that detailed information is available. The MM requests that the information regarding the engagement of individuals with 'IR Change' needs to be protected with care. The success of the project can't be attested to currently because of current circumstances still prevailing. The MM informs Cllr. Robinson that the other interventions which he cited was not only for the Avian Park area, but the information cited was only the Avian Park portion. There is a bigger scope across the board.
- Cllr. Nel asks if these projects were paid from the R500 000.00.
- The MM answers no, but some of it was. The MM informs the committee that the
  reason that mention is made regarding other interventions is to give feedback
  regarding interventions as whole, but if the committee wants to limit the scope to
  the R500 000.00, then it can be done.
- Cllr. J Jack raises his confusion regarding R500 000.00 that needed to be utilised for Avian Park. Cllr. Jack raises concern regarding other wards in Breede Valley.
   Cllr. Jack mentions violence currently in Riverview and why money cannot be provided to other wards.
- Cllr. Nel states that the item on the agenda is the R500 000.00 regarding Avianpark and the interventions of the company *IR Change* that needs to be discussed. Cllr. Nel states that the way she sees the question is, whether it was a waste of money using *IR Change* or not.
- The MM states that the company only did the assessment regarding the status in Avian Park. The MM states that Province paid the one payment of R500 000.00

and our portion was a R300 000.00 payment which a report was received for and put before council by Mr. J Martinus at the time. The MM states that along with that we paid R200 000.00 and that we also received a grant from APL.

- Cllr. E van De Westhuizen, states that R500 000.00 was given to do the
  assessment to *IR Change* and that they will come back with suggestions that must
  be implemented. The Cllr asks who will be responsible for the expenditure with
  regards to the implementation of the suggestions based on the completed
  assessment. Cllr. Van de Westhuizen states that *IR Change* received the payment
  but what is given back from the R500 000.00 into the community.
- Cllr. Nel states that consultation companies are generally paid per hour for their time and for solutions and asks if there is a report regarding the R500 000.00 paid to the company.
- The MM states that there is a report regarding our portion which is R300 000.00 and it was tabled in council. The MM further states that the Municipality's duty is to provide a clean and healthy environment. The other responsibilities regarding social welfare will be external bodies and other departments. The MM states it is difficult to express value for money. Cleaning was directed to the Municipality; therefore, contractors in the area was implemented; youth support was developed, and this is the reason why the information regarding other interventions were cited.
- Cllr. J Robinson states that crime prevention is not the primary function of the Municipality. Cllr. Robinson suggests that part of a recommendation that we need to develop should be that the municipality should be part of a crime prevention strategy and that other departments should be held accountable for their role in the strategy.
- Cllr. Robinson raises concern regarding the skills development of the youth and what will happen with the students that went through learnerships.
- Cllr. T Wehr gives clarity to the committee that students were sent to Christians
  Academy and Northlink Colleges and there is still youth going. With regards to
  Christians Academy the student is offered a 1-year employment contract after
  completion of learnership and the expenditure of the employment contract is paid
  by Department of Community Safety. After the one year and the student had
  performed in the workplace, they may be accommodated if the vacancies arise.
- Cllr. L Willemse asks how information was advertised regarding skills development.
- The MM states that it was not only meant for Avian Park but, for the whole Breede Valley and that it was widely advertised.

- Cllr. J Robinson states that a critical role needs to be implemented by education Department if we want to look at the success of this skills development program.
- The MM states that he supports what Cllr. Robinson is indicating and that what we
  are doing is very little in accordance with other the mandate that we need to fulfil.
  The MM states that stakeholder engagements regarding these issues is important
  and that we need to find a strategy to collectively address the challenge.
- Cllr. E Van de Westhuizen states that the Municipality cannot intervene alone, and other departments needs to intervene.
- The MM states that there was an arrangement with Boland College to let students to in-house training with certain businesses in the area.
- Cllr. Nel ask how many students who received skills development were gangsters or responsible for crime in Avian Park was there a real solution regarding crime prevention in Avian Park.
- The MM states that this is not an undignified process. The target group of the skills development program was grade 9 and unemployed to provide them with a skill. It is difficult to say what impact the program had on crime prevention.
- Cllr. Nel ask whether the R500 000.00 was utilised or wasted or is there something else on the table to help the community out there.
- The MM states that according to him, the portion that the Municipality spent, was well spent in the time frame when people were committed and busy.
- Cllr. Buswana, asks whether we got value for our money and asks if there is a report on this in order to scrutinise the report if there is one. Cllr. Buswana states that according to her the money spent in Avian Park has not made a difference because the situation is still the same.
- Cllr. Jack states that he would not say that the money was not used for the purpose
  meant for. The problem is still the same although the money was enrolled. Cllr.
  Jack states that the council tried to intervene and did create various opportunities.
  The Cllr states that consultants are not the option and that sport is a tool that is
  within the community that can be utilised as a strategy.
- Cllr. Nel states that a recommendation needs to be formulated to council.

#### Recommendation:

That the Municipality must draft a Safety Strategy, together with other stakeholders such as Provincial, National Government and other stakeholders, led by the Deputy Mayor, and a progress report to be tabled to council at the next council meeting.

- The MM states that the strategy needs to lead to implementation rather than assessments.
- Mr. E Cloete informs the committee that it takes note with regards to the instruction
  to the committee which is the council resolution and asks that a discussion
  regarding the multi-party committee take place. That the committee take note that
  the R300 000.00 could not be established where it came from. In terms of the R 1
  Million, that there is currently R500 000.00 in the current financial year available.
- Cllr. J Robinson states that the community leaders with the councillor in the area should take responsibility for the specific area.
- Mr. Cloete informs the committee that it is common knowledge that the multi-party committee was not functional and suggests to the committee that a recommendation be tabled to council regarding this.

#### **Final Recommendation:**

- That Council takes note that the MPAC Committee has analysed the council resolution and recommends the following:
  - That the committee has exercised oversight on the expenditure of the intervention programs in Avian Park;
  - ii. That a safety strategy be developed with other stakeholders such as Community, Provincial and National Government.

Cllr. Nel states that the councillors go and discuss it with their various caucus and the matter be discussed at the council meeting to see if there is progress.

#### 6.2 TELEFOON REKORDS VAN DIE BURGERMEESTER EN HAAR KOMITEE. C94/2018.

- Cllr. Nel reads the Council Resolution regarding the telephone records and makes the item available for discussion.
- The MM states that the request was that the Municipal Manager compile a report and make it available to MPAC. A report was made as per council resolution and was analysed from date from implementation. The MM clarifies the difference

between the official code and private pin code usage and request Mr. Cloete to guide the committee through the report.

- Cllr. Nel states that the recommendation of the council resolution does not match the instruction in the motion.
- The MM states that the report is based on the council resolution which is considered as the instruction to be implemented.
- Mr. E Cloete guides the committee through the content of the report.
- Cllr. Nel ask whether official calls are only calls within the municipality.
- The MM states that the individual must stipulate whether the call is private or official
  and there is a responsibility on management and supervisors to monitor the
  possible misuse of phone calls because they receive monthly reports which must
  be supervised. The MM states that certain restrictions were rolled out throughout
  the Municipality as mentioned in the report.
- Cllr. Buswana asks regarding the date of implementation and the trail period and whether the information in the document in the report has been tested.
- The MM states that yes it was tested, and the information provided was from date of implementation of the new monitoring system.
- Mr. Cloete informs the committee that the new monitoring system was developed because the previous system could not detect between private and official calls.
- Cllr. J Robinson asks regarding the access allowance to all councillors.
- The MM states that the allowance provide for an access usage allowance and it is not restricting anything certain councillors use cell phones for calls. The tools of trade for full time councillors provides a telephone and provides official calls.
- Cllr. J Robinson ask whether a councillor like himself can come in to make a call to a taxpayer and whether this is allowed.
- Mr. Esau states that a call cannot be made without a pin. There is a process to get a pin and without the pin the councillor cannot make a call. All the phones are aligned to a pin.
- Cllr. J Robinson asks whether the other towns are excluded from this exercise.
- The MM responded that all towns are included.


- Cllr. Robinson asks whether there have been situations of suspicious telephone calls.
- The MM states that the executive analyses the top 100 list of calls and directly zoom into the person responsible, time frames and what call was all about. The MM informs the committee regarding restrictions implemented that were made and explains the process how the restrictions on telephone calls works currently.
- Cllr. Nel asks regarding the councillors with no telephone usage records.
- The MM states that the report does not indicate that the individual councillors did not make any calls, and that all individuals have a pin code but that none of the pins of the individuals were attached to calls under the reviewed period.
- Cllr. Nel asks the possibility regarding the review of the printed telephone records at the next MPAC meeting.
- Mr. Cloete informs the committee that for the months that there are no telephone
  calls attached to councillors he is unable to provide supporting documentation
  because there are no supporting records.
- Cllr. J Robinson states that he withdraws himself from the review of the documents.
- Cllr. Buswana states that the review of documents should be done collectively and not individually.
- Cllr. Nel ask the committee whether they are happy with the report and that a recommendation be tabled to council.
- Cllr. Jacobs states that she is happy with the report that was presented.
- Cllr. J Robinson requested that it be recorded that he withdraws from any recommendations and reviews of telephone records;

#### Recommendation:

#### The committee recommends:

- i. That the committee has reviewed the report of the telephone usage as per council resolution submitted by the MM to the MPAC.
- ii. The committee recommends to council that the Municipal Manager must ensure that monitoring on the telephone usage are taking place on a more regular basis.

The chairperson closed the meeting at 12:55.

#### **Summary**

- The information above was extracted from the telephone system by Finance Department and the amounts is VAT Excluded. Mr. Mawanda Ndamoyi indicated that after these reports are extracted from the system, 15% VAT are calculated before the reports are sent to Mrs. Joan Damas for deduction of private calls from salaries. An Excel sheet provided by Mrs. Joan Damas confirms that all private calls made by employees from the organisation are deducted from their salaries.
- A Total of 4302 calls was made from councillors of the Mayco Office during the period of February 2018 – February 2019. The date of implementation of the new telephone monitoring system was 01 March 2018 but a trial period was tested in February 2018 as confirmed by Mr. Z Solomon: Senior Manager; ITC.
- The Total costs incurred for the abovementioned telephone calls amounts to R5888.98.

- Private calls made by councillors amounted to a total of 824 calls with the amount of R748.64.00 charged for the calls VAT excluded.
- The total number of calls made by additional officials of the Mayco Office amounts to 15038. The amount billed for these calls is R13 364.00. According to the information provided, 2 private calls were made for the period under review out of the total mentioned above, with the amount of R1.01 charged.
